In this respect Greater London can be treated as a single entity.</li> <li>• A separate campus identifier should be used when a merger takes place, to identify any merged HEIs as separate campuses if they otherwise fit the specified criteria.</li> <li>• Campus identifiers can only be used where a contract can be associated with a single site. It is recognised that because of the flexibility of employment patterns adopted by some HEIs, it will be impossible to say categorically that some staff are assigned to a particular campus.
