

Review of Nursing codes

Purpose

The Department of Health had indicated that the nursing codes needed to be reviewed as the coding frame did not provide sufficient detail, was out of date and did not reflect current nursing practice.

Changes to be implemented

- Analysis of HESA 2006-07 data indicated that the whole of the B7 area was fairly crowded with B700, "Nursing" and B740 Adult nursing had the greatest usage.
- Analysis of UCAS accepted applicant data indicated that the use of B700 appeared to have dropped, with other areas expanding, most notably B740 Adult nursing.
- For many of the codes, revised wording is proposed as the descriptions were considered to be out of date.
- Code B711 District nursing is to be discontinued as District Nurses are now referred to as Community Nurses.
- B730 Paediatric nursing is to be renamed Children's nursing and code B741 Geriatric nursing changed to Nursing older people as the former titles were considered out of date.

- The wording for B770 Medical nursing has been revised to differentiate it from Surgical nursing, which has been added as a separate code B772.
- What had been coded as B780 Paramedical nursing is to be renamed Paramedical science and recoded to B950 under subject line B9 Others in subjects allied to medicine and a new code of B773 Emergency nursing to be introduced to enable differentiation between the subjects.
